ADDRESSING THE ISSUES "Life in the Body" 1 Corinthians 12:1-31

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It seems the Corinthians were abusing their spiritual gifts and disrupting the life of the church. So Paul teaches them about life in the body and how it applies.

I. Life in the Body Involves Spirituality. vv. 1-3

- A. Pagan spirituality still influenced the Corinthians.
 - 1. "Moved" by dumb idols—demonic possibilities. 10:20
 - 2. Accustomed to extreme behavior—"Jesus is anathema."
 - 3. Enamored of supernatural gifts—measuring spirituality.
- B. Genuine spirituality is life in the Spirit.
 - 1. Fundamental Christian confession—"Jesus is Lord."
 - 2. This is only possible through the work of the Holy Spirit.
 - 3. The Spirit is not limited—He works unity in diversity.

II. Life in the Body Involves Diversity. vv. 4-11

- A. Reflecting the diversity of the Godhead Father, Son, and Spirit.
- B. Manifested in the diversity of gifts, ministries and outworkings.
- C. Directed towards "the common good." v. 7
- D. Predicated on the purposes of God—"as He determines." v. 11
- E. Demonstrated by gifts to believers and gifts of believers.
 - 1. Gifts to believers for the common good.
 - a. Wisdom.
- b. Knowledge. c. Faith.
- d. Healings.
- e. Miracles. f. Prophecy.
- g. Discernment. h. Tongues.
- i. Interpretation.
- 2. Gifts of believers to the body of Christ. See vv. 27-30
 - a. Apostles.
- b. Prophets.
- c. Teachers.

- d. Miracles.
- e. Healings.
- f. Helps.

- g. Administrations. h. Tongues.

(Note: d-h imply the person but emphasize the gift.)

III. Life in the Body Involves Unity. vv. 12-24

- A. The unifying experience of all believers. vv. 12-13
 - 1. All different.
 - 2. All baptized in Spirit.
- 3. All watered by Spirit.
- B. The unifying attitude of all believers. vv. 14-25
 - 1. Acceptance of divinely ordained role in the body. vv. 14-20
 - 2. Appreciation for other members of the body. vv. 21-22
 - 3. Affirmation of less visible members of the body. vv. 23-24

IV. Life in the Body Involves Mutuality. vv. 25-27

- A. Genuine concern for each other. vv. 25-26
- B. Genuine concept of each other—"Each one is a part of it."

V. Life in the Body Involves Ministry. vv. 28-31

- A. It's not the focus on gifts that is important.
- B. It's the commitment to ministry in the Spirit that matters.
