#### THE EPISTLE TO THE ROMANS "The Dangers of Religion" Romans 2:17-3:8

Having exposed the condition of pagan society, Roman and Greek, Paul turned his attention to the religious society of the Jewish people. Although he was a Jew, and proud of it, Paul did not hesitate to expose the spiritual danger inherent in religious profession.

### I. The Dangers of Profession Without Performance. vv. 17-24

- A. Profession. vv. 17-20
  - 1. A special name—"Call yourself a Jew. "

  - 2. A special foundation—"Rely on the law."
    3. A special relationship—"Your relationship to God."
  - 4. A special insight—"You know His will...."
  - 5. A special conviction—"You are convinced...."
- B. Performance. vv. 21-24
  - 1. Teaching without learning. v. 21a
  - 2. Preaching without practicing. vv. 21b-22
  - 3. Bragging without behaving. v. 23
- C. Possibilities.
  - 1. Suffering from spiritual myopia.
  - 2. Causing others to stumble.
  - 3. Bringing dishonor to God's Name.

#### II. The Dangers of Ritual Without Reality. vv. 25-29

- A. Ritual. v. 25a
  - 1. The establishment of covenant. Genesis 17:10
  - 2. The institution of circumcision.
  - 3. The erosion of commitment. Deuteronomy 10:12-22
- B. Reality. vv. 25b-29
  - 1. External sign is not substitute for internal intention.
  - 2. External sign gives no freedom for unfaithfulness.
  - 3. External sign in flesh portrays inner work of Spirit.
- C. Repercussions.
  - 1. Circumcised lawbreakers are condemned by uncircumcised pagans.
  - 2. Uncircumcised pagans who obey receive God's praise.
  - 3. Circumcised lawbreakers receive man's praise.

Note: "Judah" = "Praise."

#### III. The Dangers of Privilege Without Perception. 3:1-2

- A. The danger of abusing privilege—"The very words of God."
- B. The danger of desregarding responsibility.
- C. The danger of exaggerating personal importance.

## IV. The Dangers of Objections Without Objectivity. 3:3-8

- A. Objections.
  - 1. If the religious are so bad, how can they still be privileged?
  - 2. If they aren't still privileged, God is unfaithful.
  - 3. If our sin proves His justice, He is using us.
  - 4. We may as well sin more and make God look better!
- B. Objectivity.
  - 1. Objectivity requires an acknowledgment of sin.
  - 2. Objectivity demands a recognition of hypocrisy.
  - 3. Objectivity projects a reverence of God.

Conclusions: Pagans suppress what they know of God. Religious know more but still come short.
