Paul's statement, "You are not under law but under grace," while wonderfully true, is often woefully misunderstood and misapplied. This section examines the believer's relationship to the law.

I. The Believer's Release from the Law. vv. 1-6

- A. An illustration. vv. 1-3
 - 1. The law of marriage.
 - 2. The release from law.
- B. An application. vv. 4-6
 - 1. Mr. Law is holy (v. 12), good (v. 13), spiritual (v. 14), demanding (Galatians 3:10).
 - 2. Mrs. Law is frustrated, humiliated. v. 5
 - 3. Mr. Law dies (analogy convoluted!).
 - 4. Mrs. Law is free to remarry.
 - 5. Mrs. Law becomes Mrs. Risen-From-Dead.

II. The Believer's Respect for the Law. v. 7

- A. Law cannot reproduce righteousness.
- B. Law can expose sin.
- C. Law does reveal inner realities.

III. The Believer's Revelation Through the Law. vv. 8-13

- A. The Law stands for holiness, justice and goodness.
- B. This is life.
- C. "This do and you shall live" Principle of operation.
- D. Not doing brings death—unholy, unjust, not good.
- E. Sin has been unmasked.

IV. The Believer's Relationship to the Law. vv. 14-25

- A. Awareness of condition. vv. 14, 18
 - 1. Carnal, sin-enslaved in contrast to Law. v. 14
 - 2. Carnality incapable of spirituality. v. 18
- B. Acknowledgment of conflict. vv. 15, 18-19
 - 1. Puzzlement and disappointment. v. 15
 - 2. Ambivalence and contradiction. vv. 18-19
- C. Arrival at conclusion. vv. 17, 20-25
 - 1. Since I have a sensitivity to holiness...
 - 2. ...And a proclivity to ungodliness...
 - 3. ...I am a battleground.
 - a. I am wretched.
 - b. I am in need of help.
 - c. I know where to find it.
 - d. I am aware the conflict will persist.
 - e. I know through the Spirit there is triumph.

Application:

- 1.) Legalists need to recognize law reveals sin and leads to Christ.
- 2.) Antinomians need to acknowledge law is good, man is sinful.
- 3.) Believers need to remember the conflict continues but the Spirit enables.
