- 1. What problems can you identify in this story? Are solutions presented?
- 2. In what way might this story be relevant in your community?

Further exploration

- 1. There might not be landmines, but are there any other historical remnants of conflict, physical or not, still present in your community today?
- 2. What impact beyond the immediate physical danger to life and limb does the presence of landmines have on surrounding communities?
- 3. Most nations have signed international agreements to ban the use of landmines in modern warfare, but some, including the U.S., have not. What is the rationale for this decision?
- 4. Millions of the bombs dropped by the U.S. in the late sixties remain unexploded and/or buried. Does the U.S. have a responsibility to aid in their removal?
- 5. What can be done to help the international community not lose sight of the legacy of past conflicts, even as it tackles on-going and more recent ones?
