Further exploration

- 3. The Philipine government said that during the COVID-19 lockdowns, cases of online child sex abuse have tripled, as families struggle to earn a living while children have been out of school and spending more time online. How should this unintended consequence of the lockdown inform potential future lockdowns here and elsewhere?
