### THE PRIMACY OR CHARACTER

What is this, to gain a subject for a Baccalaureate address? A picture; the mts., their madness; the man, his poise, dignity - a something restraining. A like picture is John 18: 2-6. The soldiers, temple officers, met; the man, his purity, holiness - a something prohibiting, restraining. *What was that something in the man Jesus? & all the attributes, goodness, holiness, righteousness, purity, dignity; but for lack of a better and a more comprehensive, we shall call it character.* Jesus possessed the authority, <sup>this man's character is always good, & his acts & words are always good.</sup> character, back of his every word, deed, move in infinite worth, and all the attributes we have named. The life of Jesus was more glorified than any other. His blood more efficacious, His cross the symbol of salvation because of His worth, His purity, His character. A life in itself may be little value - an insect has life, a bad a dog; a life in itself may be decidedly harmful - a gnat, a rattlesnake, a criminal; a life may be marvelous in its power and influence - an artist, doctor, preacher, missionary, teacher. The quality, character, of life makes the difference between positive good and absolute darkness. There are many things worse than the loss of life itself, things worse than death.

It is not life, it is the quality, the character of life <sup>the rendering sorrowful</sup> human relationship beautiful and makes life itself supremely valuable.

Character, then, is primary, and this is our subject: the Primacy of Character.  
1. It must be first considered in every contact, <sup>which, then</sup> I make in life. A first consideration about effect will this first, look, see, thought, pass upon my life, and no intimate what I am, my character. We are made of malleable stuff; anything will leave its imprint upon us. We are soft as clay, and are moulded by the hands of friends and acquaintances, by the things of daily life. Many are as hard as marble, the friends and environment, others, though as dust would cover us into some kind of figure. There is a Greek word *χαράκων*, which means "cut," "imprint." The best word for the engraved mark is *χαρακτήρ*. A letter of the alphabet, cut on a wall, a mark in clay with a style, was a ". And so the word was applied to the life of a man: the summation of imprints, marks made the character of the man. Everything I come in contact with leaves some kind of an impression upon me. It leaves it in the brain, mostly, in the nerve, in all the nervous system. It leaves it in the heart, mostly, in the muscle, in the way I think, act, make decisions, likes, dislikes, wishes, aspirations. Every man <sup>and the company he keeps</sup> has some kind of influence upon me, and the closer he is to me, the deeper his imprint upon my life. What kind of friends, and what kind to soul? a wise friend, "Oh, boy, the wrong crowd."

Every thought I think, every imagination that dwells in my thinking, what kind, thoughts, star you? What kind of thoughts thoughts? What gets your attention, your imagination gets you. Kids boy crazy; boy get crazy. Directly heard would make him a fully aware. Life the networking of youthful thoughts, ideals. A library, at slave market.
