The real foe, Nebuchadnezzar was Egypt - and a great
potential rival. During Nebuchadnezzar's 42 year re-
ign, he invaded Egypt. The battle was a draw, but
when he returned he had to return to Babylon to
reorganize or replenish his armies. During the period,
when he was in Syria - Palestine, Pharaoh
of Judah paid tribute to the Babylonians [2K. 24:1]
when there was a need to return home, after
an unsuccessful attempt to subdue the king of Egypt,
Pharaoh rebelled, forcing Egypt to come to his aid.
But Judah's revolt was short. In Dec 598 (597)
the Babylonian king was in the small region.
In the same month Pharaoh died, possibly assassinated
(cf. Jn 22:18, 19, 36:30) by Judah's ally Egypt,
to replace Nebuchadnezzar.
