The second objection I notice this morning came to me in prose. It read thus: "It is incredible that a God should have visited this little world." Well, it is a little world! I read only yesterday in a child's book that a train going a mile a minute could go right round this little world in less than twenty days. And if that same railway train, at that same wonderful speed, should go continuously towards the nearest fixed star it would take that train forty million years to get there. Yes, it is a little world! A very little world! But its mere bulk may not matter so much with God, as this objector would seem to suggest. For let me remind you that Emerson says, "There is no great and no small, to the God who maketh all." And when I look at how God moves in the minute things of His making, I fail to see that size weighs much in His judgment. For these scientific philosophers of our day have done us wonderful service. They have proven to us that everything is in a condition of motion, and of motion so marvelous it is beyond the ken of the judgment, and lends itself to the imagination alone. And there are atoms quivering with molecular motion, by the million, about you wherever you look; and they are all moving with the velocity of thought. And they tell us there are so many of these atoms in marvelous motion in the single head of a pin that it would take two hundred and fifty thousand years to count them. Now, if God had constructed the world after that fashion, I don't think He is going to say, "How much does it weigh; and how much space does it occupy?" But it is a little world! Yet I read how a Hebrew poet looked up into the sky one night, and said, "When I consider the heavens the work of Thy fingers, the moon and the stars that Thou hast ordained, what is man that Thou art mindful of him? For Thou hast made him a little lower than God." And so far as we know there is no world in God's creation that holds praying men and women except this little earth; and there is no spot in His wide universe that was ever trodden by the human feet of the divine Lord except the little world that we call earth. A little world! It was not a very big house you lived in, brother, it covered very few feet of ground, and you remember how the little plants of mignonette and pink and daisy grew in the garden, and there were a dozen roots of strawberry and some currant bushes, and raspberry vines, and a cherry tree, and an apple tree, and a pear tree; and when the fence was fixed, it enclosed just a little space and yet the eyes grow moist, as we say:

"How dear to my heart are the scenes of my childhood,
When fond recollection presents them to view;
The orchard, the meadow, the deep-tangled wild-wood.
And every loved spot that my infancy knew."

But it was a little home! You have the emphasis on the wrong word. It was a little home! That is the way you should say it.
