#### Baptists and Baptism

With a note of nostalgia Baptist preachers point many times to the "days when the people were interested in doctrinal preaching."

We believe multitudes of Baptists retain that interest yet. At least, many are interested in doctrine.

A point of reference for our contention is the response of our readers to the recent discussions of alien immersion. (Response from Beacon readers has been gratifying, too, if for no other reason than the reassurance that they read their convention's publication).

Discussion of the Baptist view of baptism began with the article by H. Rhea Gray titled "Shall We Return to the Baptist Position." He argued for a return to the doctrinal position of "that which constituted valid baptism in a Baptist church prior to the intrusion of Landmarkism."

Gray held that before Landmarkism the historic Baptist concept of baptism was "believers' baptism by immersion." The Landmark theory added to that concept, he believed, by insisting upon "believers' baptism by immersion at the hands of a Baptist minister." Thus, Gray contends, to the two historic aspects of valid baptism — that is (1) A proper meaning (as a picture or symbol of the spiritual death, burial and resurrection of the believer after conversion and not for the purpose of conversion) and (2) A proper mode (immersion)—the Landmarkists added a third reguirement: a proper administrator.

Surprisingly, reader's responses have run four to one in favor of Rhea Gray's view.
