FINISHED MYSTERY OF GOD  
THE BITTER WEST LITTLE BROTHER

An introduction, parenthesis, between 6-7 in the supernatural series.  
Distances 6-7 reads. Chapter?  
" 6-7 reads. 11:13-16 - Bright } For encouragement in trial,  
" 6-7 trumpet 10:1-11:17. - Trumpet } deliverance in suffering.

The herald - angel. 10:1-3, 5-5  
We have had nothing like this before. What a sight! One of the most sublime  
of apocalyptic descriptions and scenes.

"....."  
5:2 a strong angel speaks of a book. 7:2 the angel ascends with the seven. This  
angel descends with the seven, not only with the departure but as his minister.  
"I stood with a cloud" - clouds, signs, his majesty  
"I saw him upon his head" - "face as purple" - "face" - mercy, remembrance in  
"as the sun" - "inimitable strength" - judgment.

It is very many. This is X. But no.  
Over 60 times (beside the angel, the seven) angels are mentioned in the Rev.  
Always seen in service to him who is giving the word.  
2. "I saw him upon his head" 18:1 the sixth light with his feet > feet seen in 4.  
3. the redness "shall show forth as the sun" - "as great a wonder as the angels  
of Michael - his name means 'as like God'".  
The Lord always plainly designated: "I saw" "I saw" "I saw" "I saw" "I saw"

"right foot on sea... left on earth"  
claws in a way, that of the world created for him. How fair the head of the  
angel, how explicit the action, how through the subjugation of all to him.  
To "set foot" in a place of power - possessors & truly possessors of it Rev. 11:24  
(1) John the Lord carried on the forehead. red foot down.  
Holds in his hand the open book that shall testify the laws, great 11:27.

"voice like a lion" of majesty & power. Rev 2 the Lord, Rev 12 the Lion,  
power, herald, messenger upon messenger, messenger. It is the spirit of the living  
judgment upon the world who is upon it.

"sworn... delay no longer." In setting up the book, taking the seven of creation  
with his own hands.
