Recently awarded Nobel prize in physics
In 1977 published "A Modern View of the
Origin of the Universe."

Of three things avowed in the book, here
are two:

1. The universe is governed by a
"cosmological principle," meaning
there are definite and observable laws
throughout the creation which are
uniform and universal. It says,

"The universe is isotropic and
homogeneous. By saying it is
isotropic we mean that it appears
the same in all directions. By
saying that it is homogeneous, we
mean that it appears the same
to all observers."

The cosmological principle is the
foundation for all scientific research.
When we put our noses to the wind,

we did so believing that on the moon the same laws prevail that we find on earth.

When Armstrong spoke into his microphone on the moon, we could hear his words as we saw his lips move.

The laws throughout the universe are uniform and universal.
