[GODLY SORROW]

Definition of Terms.

① "Repentance" 8:8, 9, 10

METAMÉDÔMAI - regret, remorse  
- matt. 27:3 Judas

METABÔGÔW } - change of purpose, attitude, way  
METAVOKA } - This is the Biblical word used for repentance unto

salvation. g. Acts 20:21

It is not penitence (emotion, regretful sorrow, <sup>wid</sup>)  
" " " penitance (doing works to offset evil)  
" " " sorrow for sin (here a distinction)

" " a change of purpose, attitude, action.

g. Jonah 3:10 "God repented..."

g. Rom. 11:29 "For the gift and calling of God..."

Sorrow is one thing; the repentance which it may work  
is another thing.

② "godly sorrow" 8:9, 10, 11

KATA ÆCÓV "according to God" sorrow that  
has reference to God.

I. 7:9 "Now I rejoice . . . a good thing, a sorrow unto repentance.

Not that sorrow in itself is a good thing, but a sorrow that brings us to God is a good thing.

II. 7:10 "godly sorrow . . . sorrow of the world"

The basis for the test: that we all sorrow, grieve one way or the other. Inevitable. Come to grief, tears . . . a part of the fabric of life.

One - a world of sunshine, flowers, skyarks, music, laughter . . .  
Two - " " a tears, sorrow, death, sadness, age, disappointment

wherein religion is pertinent

1. Born into world - youth health, friends, family, sometimes perfect so long as the exterior, happy, grateful to God, back is straight. The full wrong is the young heart what it is & 'tis thy fault. ### 2. In its motivation

(1) Personal despair over failure, fear of punishment, loss  
of prestige, reputation, . . .

(2) Love.

(2) Mordly sorrow. of: Fairer visitors of Agnew at Tracy Island

### 4. In its results.

Sorrow has two results, spiritual if  
" is truly neither good nor bad. Its value depends  
upon the spirit of the person or under it falls.

if: Fire will burn straw, nothing if  
" " harder clay

if: Warmth develops energies / if, seeds sprout, short grow  
" hating decay, less fast rapidly

Sad, sorrow embittering, hardening the heart.  
Gives some experience, blow, go there life strong, heated,  
springs of compassion, power, roots of faint mirthless.

Small, sorrow leading to God.

## Sorrow Unto Repentance

Background of the text:

I Cor. from Ephesus, about not companying with sinning. LOST.<sup>2 Cor. 5:11</sup>

II Cor. " " First letter misunderstood. Household, Colos. Committee, Ephesus, Galatians.

I. Initially sent.  
May be Paul himself.

III. Cor. " " A burning letter of condemnation, written  
no tribulation. II Cor. 2:4. Sent by Titus. LOST

IV. Cor. " Macedonia. Meets Titus - Report good.

This text: II Cor. 7:8-10

Paul had to write his condemnation - even in company & tribulation Paul.  
Like the pastor - if he is a man of God, he will speak against the sins of the people.  
Like the watchmen sit in the tower; if the sound comes, the warning.

The church responded with the spirit of repentance.

II Cor. 7: 8-9

I. A Cause for Rejoicing - A Good Thing - Sorrow into Repentance  
Not that sorrow is a good thing - but a sorrow that brings us to God is a good thing.

II Cor. 7: 10

II. The Basis for the Argument - That We all Sorrow Anyways -  
One way or the other - either unto death, or unto life.

1. A part of the fabric of life is sorrow.

- (a) Two messengers sent from say, Ukraine, to visit Earth, & report.  
    1st Report: A world of sunshine, flowers, books, laughter, music, beauty  
    2nd " : True, O King, a world of sunshine & laughter. But, O King,  
        I looked a little closer and it is a world of sorrow & tears.  
        I saw them gather off the streets in the friend towns. Help.  
        Sorrow - disease - development - death.

Wherever sin is, there is heartache, tears and sorrow.  
As universal as sin is, just so universal is pain and grief.

cf. The parable of the two houses - in one house is joy, in the other is misery.

"Sorrow according to God" Crime is the Transgressor? law of man.  
    Wrong " " law of creation  
    Sin " " God.  
    (a) David "against this I have I sinned." P. 51

But not all sorrow is the same  
2. Paul divides this sorrow in two: "the sorrow of the world"  
what is the difference?

One - a sorrow forced upon us. Bitter as gall; has to drink it down. Face it through.

Other - a sorrow voluntarily accepted; conscious & willing God

(1) Any enforced sorrow, "the sorrow of the world."  
Paul's Epistles:  
My desire is in the yellow leaf;  
The fruit to fade, but as you live;  
The leaves to leave, but as you live;  
The wind to blow, but as you live.  
Sorrow for failure, for results, not for sin.  
Sorrow of Cain (not over Abel, but not to be destroyed by all men)  
Esau (regretted not over brotherly wrong, but denied it)  
Judas (remorse over misdeeds failure of life, no repentance)  
The disposition, the soul, the heart, very changed. Continues on...  
the parrot & parrot, will finally accept us. Judgment day.

(2) A godly sorrow - voluntarily entered into before the Lord.

Recognition of sin.  
Confession in the presence of the Lord. "This is not what ought to be in my life."  
"I will never do it again" Repentance - a determination, abandoning it, to turn away.  
Salvation - the turning to God in faith.

III. True repentance leading to effect, work, manifestation. —  
Mt. 12:43-45
