δῶρον - a gift

Abel offered a θυσία - a
sacrifice, but δῶρον.

Where did "sacrifice" come from?

Notice the δῶρον. So many
theologians agree to thesis that
sacrifice began as a "gift" or "present,"
an offering of thanksgiving to God.
