Nero also demanded love.

(1) If any young woman failed to return his love & affection,
he signed her death warrant that same day.
(2) If any man looked unfavorably in his presence, as if to
be with his was not better than to be in paradise, he had
his killed on the spot.

(3) When his faithful old captain of the praetorian guard,
Burrhus, complained one day of a sore throat, Nero said:
"I can cure it, & have a sure remedy" & sent him a dose of
poison.

(4) When his teacher, the philosopher Seneca seemed to be getting
more popular with the populace & more than the young emperor,
he sent him a polite note, regretting he to commit suicide.
Nero, only man he could hope to have, Seneca died.

(1) His sick aunt who loved him so much, said to him on the opposite way he had not his friend. "But now not since he is so far abroad for the first time and 'oh, what a world' said the young man -" will be shared at once. Ordering his physician to give him a death potion, he seized her without delay the breath left her body.
