God as a person, conversing, fellowshiping, working, visiting with men.

Ex. 33:11 "And Jehovah spoke unto Moses face to face as a man speaketh...

The word Person.⁴ First used by the churches in their communion
with Sabellius c 200 A.D. who looked upon the W.S. as God one

The Nicene Creed:

"And I believe in the Holy Ghost,
the Lord and giver of life, who
proceedeth from the Father [and
the Son, added in 589] was with
the Father and Son together, is
worshipped and glorified."

Athanasian creed:

"The Holy Ghost is of the Father
and of the Son neither made
nor created, not begotten but
proceeding."

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Articles of the English Church:

"The Holy Ghost proceeding
from the Father and the Son, & of
one substance, majesty, and
glory, with the Father and the
Son, very and eternal God."

Westminster Confession of Faith:

"In the unity of the Godhead
there be three persons, one
substance, power and eternity;
God the Father, and the Son, and
God the Holy Ghost. The Father is
God the Holy Ghost. The Father is
of more, neither begotten nor
proceeding; the Son is eternally
begotten of the Father; the Holy
Ghost eternally proceeding from
the Father and the Son."
