PRAISING GOD WITH DAVID

Acts 13:22 "a man after mine own heart." = the wrong preacher, small crowd under trees; ^{scanned} - but the real man?

To see the man, really, look at his poetry, psalms.

5 in II Sam. I Chron.

73 in Psalms.

POETRY INCLUDED IN NARRATIVE OR HIS LIFE

I. A Tender Heart

II Sam. 1:17-27

Lament over death, duel (and Jonathan)

Saul hunted him down like an animal
death, took his promises to the living.
But, no gloating, rejoicing over the trophy

1. David lamented
2 Sam. 1:17

2. Extolled Saul as a military leader
2 Sam. 1:23, 27

3. Publicly set the news in camp of
every
2 Sam. 1:20

4. Called for death, drought on next tiller
2 Sam. 1:21

5. Journal kept over death of Jonathan
2 Sam. 1:26

II. A Proven Heart

II Sam. 3: 27, 34

Lament was abhorred
(captain, or any under David,
slain by Joab)

personally followed the line
3: 31

The crime committed in Hebron, a
city of refuge. No pursuit or reward against Joab
permitted.

III. A Grateful Heart

II Sam. 22: 1-51

(also recorded in Psalm 18)

David wrote it toward the end of
his life - a thanksgiving song for
deliverance from his enemies, the
blessings of God upon him.

IV: A Rejoicing Heart
III I Chron. 16: 7-36 I Chron 15: 16
 David's song when the ark was : 19
 brought to Jerusalem. : 21
 : 22
 : 24
 : 28

V: A Concerned Heart
 II Sam. 23: 1-7
 David's last song
 23: 1 how expressive!
 1. 2 words of a direct message from God

1. verses 3-4
a picture of the coming Messiah
2. verse 5
a concerned heart for his family
recognized their weakness
3. verses 6, 7
a concerned heart over the wickedness of
evil men

THE POETRY OF DAVID IN THE PSALMS

73 to 150 bear his name.

I. Psalms of Prayer

31 are written as prayers.

Psalms ^{FORGIVEN} 32, ^{CONFESSORIAL} 51 serve as illustrations of
the inner meaning of David's heart.

II. Psalms of Praise

19 are devoted mainly to praise

III Psalms of Hope

Often called Messianic Psalms
intentionally among the psalms songs
Ps. 22 a Messiah who will suffer
Ps. 2 a Messiah-King to be worshipped
Ps. 45, 110 portray his Deity

Ps. 16 hope for a resurrection

GOD'S VIEW OF DAVID

1 K. 11: 4, 6
repeatedly in books of Kings & Chronicles
the King of Judah compared, contrasted
with the David

David a type of the Messiah-King
fulfilled in the greater Son of David,
the 2nd Jesus: Ps. 22, 110
