Samuel's Last and Greatest Act

David is twice alluded to in the prophet's address to Samuel to Saul.

U I Sam. 13:14 "a man after God's own heart"

2. " " 15:28

Samuel's grief for Saul

15:11, 35

16:1

Paul in Rom. 9:11, 10:1

Samuel mourned for Saul but never met the Saul who moved on to the loss of the crown, presence, Samuel. Samuel rather to be glad to get rid of a creature prefigured except Rev 9.

First indication of the new King.

16:1 The tribe of Judah - "the scepter shall not depart from Judah"
The town of Bethlehem - "and there shall be a ruler"
The family of Jesse - Ruth

The anxiety of David

16:2 the prophet knows the murderous heart of Saul
16:2, 3 God orders the prophet to protect himself with a sacrifice

16:6 Even Samuel quickly forgot the lesson, Saul, look on the outward appearance. No. all do.
1. II Cor. 10:10 the bodily presence, Paul
2. the handsome presence, Abraham

16:11, 12 Here for the first time we believe "the name of the
Lord" is used, the receipt of David into his "father's house."
David so little thought by other members of the family, he
not called to the banquet when the distinguished Samuel
came to provide with the sacrifice.
7. June - his capture July 7:5 "A prophet is not without honor"
but in 78:70, 71 and his the shepherd, Israel.

16:13 Samuel returns to his home in Ramah.

Samuel and David together

19:18-24 David flees out to his family in
Bethlehem, not to the thousands in Israel who had received
his gift, but to the eyes, treated Samuel. Unbeknownst to
Samuel receives David into his house, the king.

19:19 "Naivety" "dwellings" Near Ramah, the dwellings
of the school of the prophets provided now by Samuel.

19:22 "Samuel and David" Lying this morning
together as joint traitors to the crown. The morning after
his gift to arrest him, the closing act of his life to protect
him.

25:1 Samuel dies, 16 years after the anointing
of David. A bull in Bethlehem, a burial for the prophet.
