The Saving of the Nation

The great revivals of the middle 1700's called "the Great Awakening" Jonathan Edwards, the whitfield Howard won to the puritanism created the consciousness, a common opinion of a national unit in the West strengthened thus for the last day a heretic Revolutions were strengthened thus for the last day a heretic. The nation emerged from the struggle 18 years.

At the same time another far reaching revolution took place.
