## 'Dear American Friends'

THOSE WHO organized Wednesday's Vietnam demonstration will be pleased to know that it received warm plaudits abroad.

The North Vietnamese government newspaper hailed them in Hanoi as "our heroic comrades in arms."

Hanoi Hannah, the communist version of Tokyo Rose, told the GIs all about it in glowing terms, promising that the protest would give President Nixon a taste of the same medicine that drove President Johnson "intopolitical oblivion."

Communist diplomats in Paris were unanimous—as Communists tend to be—in their praise of the demonstration. The Viet Cong delegate cheered the demonstrators on to protest "more firmly each day so that President Nixon cannot feign indifference"

However, these reviews for the demonstrators' show of repudiation were pale compared to an open letter of congratulations, addressed simply to the reviewer's "dear American friends."

"MAY YOUR FALL offensive succeed splendidly," he told his dear American friends. "It is our firm belief that with the unity and courage of our two peoples, with the approval and support of peace-loving peoples in the world, the struggle of the Vietnamese people and progressive American people against the U.S. aggression will be completely successful."

He lauded his dear American friends for their heroic action in demanding that their President "put an end to the Vietnam aggressive war and immediately bring all American troops home."

"Your struggle," he declared to his dear American friends, "is a noble reflection of the legitimate and urgent demand of the American people, which is to safeguard the honor of the

U.S. and save their children and brothers from a useless death in Vietnam."

Though the actual concern of this writer for America's honor or its sons is highly questionable, there is no questioning his heartfelt gratitude toward his dear American friends for their works in his behalf. Their efforts to force the President to "immediately bring all American troops home" serve his cause to perfection, since that has been his own nonnegotiable demand from the beginning of the war.

THE WRITER OF this rave review for the moratorium show was none other than <u>Pham Van Dong</u>, the premier of Communist North Vietnam.

To make certain the performers received the letter in time to enjoy it during the demonstration, he had it broadcast over Radio Hanoi and communist diplomats distributed copies in both Vietnamese and English to the Western press in Paris.

However, the reviews from overseas weren't all so glowing in their praise. President Thieu was attending a mass funeral in Hue for hundreds of the "children and brothers" of the citizens of that city, murdered by the regiments of the "peace-loving peoples" from the North. He invited the leaders of the demonstration to come to South Vietnam and see for themselves what their "heroic comrades-in-arms" from the North are doing.

The British newspaper, the Daily Telegraph, called the moratorium "a spectacle to turn the stomach—a great nation in a delirium of treason and shame."

An American Seabee in Vietnam summed up the dissent most eloquently: "I think these people are going to be extremely sorry later on . . . if there ever comes a time when there's a battle on American soil and their children have to fight it on our home grounds."
