1. In its origin.

Both heavenly and earthly:
(1) Heavenly.

God made the plans, patterns. The blue-print for every detail - color, form, pattern, size, shape. The work arranged a revelation. No room, place, for human wisdom. Not man's speculation or any thing ought to be. Like the plan of salvation, all of God. Even the men who constructed the tabernacle were Spirit-directed: like Bezaleel and Ooliab. § 31:1-6

God gave the pattern for heaven. The people contributed the materials. Christ a heavenly & earthly being. God contributed his personality. Humanity " " body of Christ.

(2) Earthly

The materiality of the work the people could offer. When left Egypt the gifts (lock pay) received under the direct hand of God. So willingly, Moses had to restrain them §. 36:6,7. cf. II Cor. 8:1-9; 9:7,8

3. In its appearance.

Occupies the central position in the camp: X the center, as
fig. 1.

5. In its ~~construction~~ arrangement.

The divisions from the front building are given from God's point of view, starting at the instrument process, the ark & the mercy seat over cherubim, going out to the great altar, sacrifice. We go on, start with the altar as we go out as the mercy seat.

THE TABERNACLE IN THE WILDERNESS

(Not the temple, but the tabernacle: Heb. 8, 9.)

INTRODUCTION

1. The space consumed in the Scriptures
Exodus 25-31 [7 chapters] God's directions for construction
Exodus 35-40 [5 chapters] Moses repeats to the people.

Creation [Genesis 1, 2] two chapters

The Tabernacle [Exodus 25-31, 35-40] twelve chapters.

God said, "Let there be light" - Light.

God prescribed laws for the tabernacle - detailed laws

in commanding an army."

4. Typically, the Tabernacle pointed to Christ. The glory of his person and work are stamped on every part of it.

5. Occupied a central position in the camp. (Numbers 2:2) Christ is the center of his people.



KOHATHITES. Kohath, Levi's second son. Their charge: to carry the ark, table, and golden altar, and the vessels of the sanctuary on the bearers, but not to touch the covers, lest on them by the sin of Aaron, and not to touch them. Moses of that family. Also Samuel. Eleven golden vessels are inscribed with their names.

MERARITES - MERARI, Levi's third son. Their charge: to follow after Judah's standard to set up the outer tabernacle for the covering of the Kohathites. Thus the heavy part: pillars, boards, etc. 4 wagons, 8 oxen assigned them.

GERSHONITES - GERSHON, Levi's eldest son. Their charge: to carry the tent coverings, hangings, curtains, etc. not so heavy, so two wagons and four oxen assigned them. Asaph, second singer, son, one of them.

INTRODUCTION (CONTINUED)

1. How the materials were collected

(1) There was a popular response. Ex. 35: 20-29
[How come the Israelites to have all these precious possessions: Ex. 3: 21, 22; 12: 36.]

(2) There was a tremendous spirit of willingness. They were inventive in their beneficence. Moses had to restrain them. "too much" Ex. 36: 6, 7.
cf. II Co. 8: 1-5; 9: 7, 8.

2. The principal workmen

(1) Bezaleel. Ex. 31: 1-5
of the tribe of Judah - 1st in the march Numbers 10: 14

(2) Aholiab. Ex. 31: 6
of the tribe of Dan - 12th (last) in the march. Numbers 10: 25
cf. Peter at his fishing - John Wesley of Oxford
Paul at the feet of Gamaliel - Dwight L. Moody of Chicago
Ex. 31: 3 it is God who qualifies us

(3) Every one whose heart stirred him to work.
Ex. 31: 6b = Ex. 35: 21, 22, 25, 26

3. The Various names given to the tabernacle.

(1) "Tabernacle of [the] congregation" Ex. 27:21

Indicates the purpose for the children of Israel. Actually, ^{and the entire} "tabernacle of meeting" in its full designation Ex. 40:2, 29 "tabernacle of meeting" ^{is not the people meeting one another, but God meeting the people in His representative.}

(2) "Tabernacle of the Lord"

Indicates God's dwelling place.

(3) "Tabernacle of the testimony" Num. 1:50

Because in it were the two tables of stone.

(4) "Tabernacle of the witness" Num. 17:7, 8; 18:8

In connection with the rebellion of Korah (Num. 16, 17) Aaron's rod budded. The rod was stored up as a witness.

4. The purpose of the tabernacle.

Ex. 25:1, 8 "And the Lord spoke unto Moses saying, Speak unto the children of Israel, ... that they make me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them."

of John 1:14 ἑσκήνωσεν (transitive)
ἑσκήνω = to pitch tent
= to encamp
= to tabernacle, dwell in a tent

It was God's first dwelling place on earth
God walked with Adam
God visited Abraham
But here God comes to dwell: a type of Christ

5. Made after a heavenly pattern.

"According to the patterns" occurs four times.

Ex. 25:9 "According to all that I show thee, after the pattern of the tabernacle ... even so shall ye make it"

Ex. 25:40 "And look thou, that thou make them after their patterns, which was showed thee in the mount."

Ex. 26:30 "And thou shalt rear up the tabernacle according to the fashion thereof which was showed thee in the mount."

Ex. 27:8 "As it was showed thee in the mount, so shall they make it."

Moses faithfulness. Ex. 39:42, 43 "According to all that the Lord commanded Moses, so the children of Israel made all the work. And Moses did look upon all the work, and, behold, they had done it as the Lord had commanded, even so had they done it."

Heb. 8:5 "... the sanctuary and shadow of heavenly things, as Moses was admonished of God when he was about to make the tabernacle: for, See, saith he, that thou make all things according to the pattern showed to thee in the mount." [referring to the above Ex. 25:40]
