### THE TABLE OF SHOWBREAD

An emblem before God above and Israel below of what  
Christ is to his people: "the bread of life." John 6:32, 33, 47-51  
The table and the bread considered one, a mystic mystery common in  
scripture and deep language. I Cor. 10:21 says "the table / a table / a table"  
looks forward to the other table, the Lord's supper, the long table of the  
believers in Christ, stretching from the Upper Room to the Upper Air.

I. The construction of the table  
"wood" - probably the wood: X<sup>1/4</sup> diameter  
"gold" - X<sup>1/4</sup>. Out. All outside, in every branch. <sup>up</sup>  
"gold" - X<sup>1/4</sup>. Out. All inside, in tokens. gold <sup>up</sup>  
<sup>down</sup>

A golden border around the top of a showbread?  
So in the sculptured relief on the Ark, Titus, the  
stands. Read not gold the table is just the breads & the  
borders.

## II The Bread.

Bread th stoff? b. Represents our very life.  
This is the day over which lies my power for salvation? b.  
Our life depends upon Christ; we must feed upon Christ  
no ordinance, memory, warrant, chart, personal  
arrangement, religious practice, can now take the place of  
feeding upon Christ, appropriety &c. Without Christ we perish.  
A gift of heaven, manna from heaven.

Lxx. 24:3 = John 12:28-33

1. Baled of fine flour Lxx. 24:5

(1) fine flour! The perfect expression of Christ if on  
earth. (2) note right & flour again is again ego  
body. In men, grace vary; but it is Christ, perfectis  
in every place.

(2) Broken fine, baled in the fire. The seed cast  
into a ground dry, grows to be into strong, broad.  
cast it away. Our sufficiency, we need Christ.

2. Twisting leaves <sup>now</sup> ~~now~~  
Two piles, ~~one~~ to a pile.

One log for each of the twelve trials: big greenish  
franklinia Rubra  
greatly Izzi

Each on same ground, relatively I Cor 10:17 The  
tribe members greatly differed, but is green, dry, all  
the same.  
*"For we being many are one body  
and one spirit; for we are all  
partakers of one body."*

3. Placed fresh on the table every Saturday  
(1) The Blessings, yesterday - but went swimming today  
in the lake, yesterday - th <sup>to</sup> today  
(2) The Affirmations, yesterday - the experience, today  
the manna fell fresh next day.

4. "Bread of the presence" Ex. 25:30  
"bread of the face" of God. "In the presence" <sup>show</sup>  
"showbread" <sup>is shown</sup>  
"before the Lord" Lev. 24:6 <sup>"presentable"</sup>  
<sup>in exhibition</sup>

On the top of each row, a golden ring of frankincense  
Lev 24:7. when bread changed, eaten by the  
priests in the sanctuary on the Sabbath, the frankincense  
was placed on the alter walls, "an offering made by  
fire unto the Lord." "Pray, wash, renew in the  
morning" Hode.

The priests by the bethel (Ex. 22:10<sup>th</sup>)  
unleavened wheat out). went round by the alter (the  
cross) the lawn, washing (wash again & water &  
spirit). The bethel per 22:15 "for without .."  
21:24 "thus will an unclean shall wash in it .."

## THE TABLE OF SHEWBREAD

Ex. 25: 23-30; 37: 10-16; 40: 22 and 23 (right)  
Lev. 24: 5-9; Numbers 4: 7, 8

Can emblem before the above and mark below of what  
Christ is to his people: "the bread of life." Jn. 6: 33-58  
The table and the bread considered one. Same terminology for both. J. 1 Cor. 10: 20  
fools proceed to the other table, the foolish Sopper.

### 1. Materials.

"Shittim wood and pure gold" Ex. 25: 29, 31  
product of the earth

Christ's humanity

Christ's deity

### 2. Measurements

Length 2 cu. [3']

Breadth 1 cu. [ $1\frac{1}{2}$ ']

Height  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cu. [2' 3"]

The border  was to be "a handbreadth". or  $\frac{1}{2}$  the width of a man's hand  
The purpose of this is to keep the slaves hand that  
holds the table is just the breadth of the border.

The crown of gold served the purpose of keeping in  
place everything on the table.

2 Bread we offer / up - represents our very self. "This is... my bread" Only fit for offering, unblemished, unbroken, clean, personal instrument, priest, can eat it in place of firstfruits before the altar.

### Worship, 3. The bread

Every Sabbath, 12 loaves baked, fine flour. Removed today before the other

gods. by the priests.

Agst? (1) Ex. 25:30 called "bread of the face" the "face" stands

for the person. Agst? the "bread of the face" or the table

in the sanctuary symbolizes that man is admitted to

God's Holy table and presence, manifested by God in Christ.

We are fed at the table table, bread of life.

Christ true food, Christ himself.

Bread of the presence of God, bread, because

we are fed in the presence of God.

Exodus 4:7 called "the continual bread"

I Sam. 21:6 called "hallowed bread."

David and

his men came to Nob, to Ahimelech the high priest. Hungry,

"So the priest gave him hallowed bread, for there was no

bread here but the shewbread, that was taken from before the

table, to put hot bread in the day when it was taken

away."

Mt. 12:4 [Jesus referring to the above story] called

τοῦς ἀπόνους τῆς θηρασίας "the bread of setting forth"

(2) Twelve loaves in two piles, six to a pile. One loaf

for each of the twelve tribes. Ex. 24:5-6

Each cake contained about  $\frac{3}{10}$  of an ephah [an ephah =

dry measure = little more than a bushel]. So each cake

weighed about  $6\frac{1}{2}$  lbs.

The 12 loaves equal 1/2 for every one. Little bread - big soul

Each a son of ground of relationship I Cor 10:47

(3) The twelve cakes, arranged in two piles, had on top of each now a golden cup of incense [cf. Exodus 30:7] Lev. 24:7 When the bread changed, eaten by the priests in the sanctuary on the Sabbath, the frankincense was placed on the altar bals "an offering made by fire unto the Lord." Incense = always prayer, worship. Eating reverentially.

(4) The cakes made of "fine flour," Lev. 24:5.

Type: ① The beautiful, perfect manhood of Christ. Is not character, in the last, of man this grain very, some more others, more less than others. But in Christ Jesus, there was the perfection of every grain.

: ② Suffering. The seed must die in the ground, die [John 12:23-32] - <sup>Burton fine bread: eat at fire of affliction</sup> known to be cut down, buried, cast into the oven. Isa. 53. Our Saviour is not crucified Christ.

(5) The loaves were twelve, one east to a tribe, of equal weight, size. The tribes themselves greatly differed, Judah, Ephraim, Benjamin, Dan. But in the presence of God, all equal, the same.

(6) Fresh bread placed on the table every Sabbath.  
So with the children of God: Experience past - but present  
: the Christ we enjoyed yesterday  
today, fresh  
: Marans full fresh each day

(7) Lev. 24:6 "And thou shalt set them ... upon the  
pure table before the Lord." <sup>Exodus 25:30 "shewers" = bread + a</sup>  
you "bread of the presence"  
Our presentation before God. Meditations of our minds  
the desires of our hearts  
the submission of our wills  
the consecration of our efforts.

Only for believers. Ex. 22:10 Worshippable priesthood? No, believers  
must come by the altar (the cross) the house of God (by means of  
our agios, of water and spirit). "Like Heaven" for visitors? ...  
"the redeemed" the God wall this.

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#### 4. History.

Solomon II Chron. 4: 8, 19; I K. 7: 48; II Chron. 29: 18  
made 10 tables and one great golden one on which they  
set the loaves. of. the 10 golden candlesticks he made.

No table is listed in the <sup>articles</sup> restored from  
Babylon [Ezra. 1: 9-11], so it was doubtless removed by  
Babylonians.

Antiochus Epiphanes [II Macc. 1: 22] carried away the  
table of the same temple. A new one was made at the  
restoration of the temple by Judas Macabeus. (I Macc. 4: 49).

Afterwards, Ptolemy Philadelphia presented a splendid  
table (Jsc. 12, 2, 8-9)

In the And of Titus, the sculptor in defiance of  
persecution exhibits the two ends.
