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## THE WEAPONS OF OUR WARFARE

Barn's letters, full of personal feeling, mostly written at white heat.

(Vindication of his apostolic ministry against bitter  
things said about him.)

The slanderers said, Paul "walked according to the flesh" a law-scholar.  
He answers, "Yes, this is the flesh, a mortal man, but I go soldiering  
not according to the flesh. my rules of battle, my weapons of warfare,  
are not from the flesh. they are of God as therefore mighty."

Then the metaphor, as it were, catches fire. Expands the figure of a warfare. The remarkable spectacle of a ministry of the gospel of peace (10:1 "the meekness and gentleness" that) goes forth to war. 16 steps before us  
"pulling down of strong holds," destruction, judgment  
"casting down every high thing"  
"brings the captivity" leading captives away  
"readiness to reward all the righteous" stern judgment against rebels still already out

But the weapons of the warfor are of a spiritual kind. "Not carnal." Not like the weapons of the world, that inflict terrible agony, w<sup>i</sup>p<sup>h</sup>, death. But weapons of a very different sort. Spiritual - for the destruction of the works of Satan - "the blinding of the soul, leading of Christ.

## I. The Opposing Fortress.

The Christian soldier with the <sup>convict</sup> message of Christ, strongly opposed. Strong red bastions, fortresses, lofty walls, frowning down on any assailants. When the gospel endeavours to penetrate the denser heart, meets earthworks of visited opposition.

(1) The man enclosed in fortress of self-sufficiency. Not need God, no place for God. No humble dependency upon God. Busy business, build house, rear children, live by without God.

(2) The man enclosed in high tower of false pride, cultural, intellectual conceit. Refusing to those who are need of us, the gospels and answers to ignorant. A superficial, conceited, self-shut-out God. These towers, with "high things" <sup>These towers, with "high things"</sup> <sup>the lofty castle.</sup>

(3) The man behind heavy walls, sly, sneaking light of God roofed over by heavy beams. Light showing dark recesses of heart, sin, depravity, shut out.

He says:

The terrible sin of neglect, indifference. "How shall we escape if neglect of grace? how better sin, this of rejecting one of charity."
