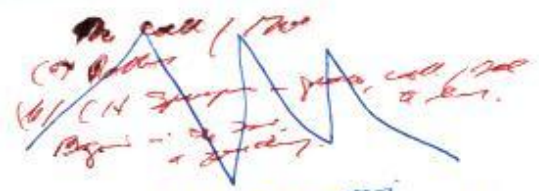

died, Rabbi (compiler of the Mishna)
was born. On the day when the
Rabbi compiler of the Mishna died,
Rabbi YEHUOAH was born. On
the day when Rabbi Yehudah died,
Rabbi RAVA was born. On the day
when Rabbi Rava died, Rabbi ASHI
(one of the editors of the Gemara) was
