Editorial, Chicago newspaper:

"We are struck with the  
hypocrisy and treachery of  
these attacks on Christianity.

This is a free country  
and a free age and men  
can say what they please  
about religion, but this  
is not what we assign  
these divinity professors for.

Is there no place to assail  
Christianity but a divinity  
school? Is there no one

to write infidel books  
except professors of Christian  
theology? Is a theological  
seminary an appropriate place  
for a general massacre?  
Christian doctrines? We are  
not championing either  
Christianity or infidelity, but  
only condemning infidels  
masquerading as men of  
God and Christian Teachers."

Sanford Bates, director of Federal prisons, 1935

"In the first year of repeal prison population increased by 25% and the increase in crime was beyond estimate."

Lord Hugh Cecil, son of the former  
Lord Salisbury, premier of Great Britain,  
declared that the great danger that  
threatens us is not the people
