THE CHALLENGE—

When a natural disaster or humanitarian emergency strikes in a developing country or here in the U.S., it's common to feel powerless. At the same time, there is a desire to respond with effective life-saving aid but also to assist while families recover and rebuild.

THE OPPORTUNITY—

This is what World Vision's "first-in, last out" effective approach in disaster response looks like—

- » Accessing pre-positioned relief supplies like clean water, emergency food, hygiene and cooking kits, and temporary shelters and blankets
- » Global rapid response team members on the ground within 24 to 72 hours of the disaster, making assessments and beginning to provide emergency relief.
- » Support in restoring access to basics like clean water, food security, education and healthcare, and livelihoods
- » Child-Friendly Spaces that give kids a safe place to play, learn, and heal from traumatic experiences
- » Training to help communities prepare for future disasters, so people and property are more resilient
