Prior to joining Giving Company in 2015, David was president and CEO of Nextech Systems, president of Healthcare Information Solutions at Carestream Health, senior vice president and general manager at McKesson Corporation, and vice president and general manager at General Electric Healthcare.

David earned a bachelor's degree from Indiana University and holds an MBA from the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University. He currently sits on the board of directors for Giving Company and has held board positions at the Global Leadership Network, the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, the Technology Association of Georgia, and Nextech Systems.
